

Setting Up Your Microsoft Account

Part One: Getting a Microsoft Account

Why do you need a Microsoft Account?

For your upcoming course UBC will be providing you with a virtual computing environment. These Virtual Machines (VM) use Microsoft Azure Lab Services and Office 365. **An active Microsoft Account is required** to access the licensed software. (What is a Microsoft Account? ©)

Do you have a Microsoft Account already?

Faculty, Staff and Undergraduate / Graduate Students:

An active Microsoft account already exists under your current UBC Email (first.last@ubc.ca) or your student CWL email (cwl@student.ubc.ca). This login type is preferred if you have it available.

Continuing and Professional Education Learners:

You may already have an active Microsoft Account if you use any of the following services: Outlook.com, Office, Skype, OneDrive, Xbox Live, or Windows. If you use one of the above services, the email associated with that service can be used to assign you a Virtual Machine. If you do not use any of the above services, you can create a Microsoft Account for free. (How do I create a Microsoft Account?

Part Two: Send your Microsoft Account information to your course instructor

In order to provide you with access to a virtual computing environment, UBC will need to associate your Microsoft Account with a Virtual Machine. Please **send the following information to** your course instructor:

- First name
- Last name
- The email address associated with your Microsoft Account
